Montrose Parkway East Has (finally) Arrived

By the time you read this, the date of an event (March 21) I am about to describe will have passed, but has not happened yet as I write this article (March 14). After over 40 years on the books, it looks like the portion of the Montrose Parkway that runs from Parklawn Drive to Viers Mill Road is finally being given legs. This is the portion that runs behind Montrose and Franklin Parks, and is shown on the RCA map in every *Echo* as "proposed Montrose Parkway (dashed line)."

I received a six-page notice in the mail yesterday (1st class) from the County's Department of Public Works & Transportation regarding the "Phase 1 Facility Planning Study" of "Montrose Parkway East between Parklawn Drive and Veirs (sic) Mill Road." A public hearing is to be held Thursday, March 21, 2002, 7 to 9:30 PM, at Wheaton High School. I don't believe the "hearing" is for pro/con arguments. Rather, it seems to be more of a "dog and pony" show where the Transportation division shows residents what's been planned so far, and taking comments from residents. I'll try to get copies of materials for the RCA general membership meeting in May.

The Planning Study has been funded by the County Council, but not the actual construction. This means that even if the process progresses smoothly, the road would not open until 2007 at the earliest, and the way life, and roads, often works out, it will likely be even later.

Transportation is a Big Deal for RCAers

At last month's (March) general membership meeting, the RCA voted to support the construction of the ICC and to study, but not necessarily build, a second Potomac River bridge that would connect Reston/Dulles with Gaithersburg. No specific path for these projects has been definitively selected (the ICC has four possible alignments, for example), so the votes taken in March did not advocate a specific path either. However, what these votes indicate is an acknowledgment of a problem, namely, a severe lack of transportation capacity in Montgomery County. The ICC and the 2nd Bridge do not come physically close to the RCA, but the effects of their absence are felt: heavy traffic on Randolph Road. Further, the general quality of life in Montgomery is lower because of poor transportation infrastructure. Yes, we live in RCA-land, but many of us travel to other parts of the County, such as Sam's Club in Gaithersburg, for example.

President's Message

About seven years ago, the County changed the way it collected your trash. It stopped "backyard pickups." Once upon a time, you didn't have to worry about trash day, except to roll over and ignore the early-morning banging of trashcans. The trashmen (oops, civil engineer technicians) would go into your backyard, empty the trash onto a huge canvas tarp, and replace your cans right where you left them. Never were there bits of blowing trash after they left, and the bluebirds of happiness always sang – way too early in the morning.

But that was then, and I don't have to explain the now. Now we play "hide-and-seek" not with kids, but with trashcans. Some RCAers write their address on their trashcan. Not because they're afraid their neighbors will steal them, but instead hoping some good soul, miles from home, will return it from its wandering odyssey.

The good-intentioned County trash representatives were guest speakers at the RCA's March '02 meeting (see meeting minutes on page 4). They attempted to address RCAers' concerns about how to keep trashcans down on the farm. The reps said "we've had a real windy winter," and how school kids and passerbys will put stuff in your trashcans (so THAT'S the problem!). The County trash supervisors acknowledged a simple fact: leaving a lightweight, plastic trashcan out by the curb is just asking it to run away from home.

The RCA hears you. We "feel your pain." But we don't have an answer.

Minutes of the RCA General Meeting

March 7, 2002

President Kevin Kline opened the meeting with three announcements. First, we will have a guest speaker at our Thursday, May 2nd General Meeting: a Metro Flexicar rep will brief us on how we can now rent a car at Metro stations.

Second, the RCA has been contacted by an organization that wants our endorsement. "Marylanders for Better Transportation" wants a steady revenue stream for road projects throughout the State. Presently, the State has a trust fund to pay for road projects, and it has a \$29 billion short-fall. Maryland is one of the few states that does Services talks to RCAers about trash collection and recycling. not have a constant revenue stream for road projects.

And third, the Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission (MNCPPC) responded to our letter, where we complain about large, unsupervised soccer crowds in our Randolph Hills Local Park. The MNCPPC is considering our proposals to improve the situation.

The RCA's guest speakers were representatives responsible for your trash & recycling collection. Gabriel George and Jim Fustero work for the County's Division of Public Works and Transportation, Division of Solid Waste Services. Kevin bluntly warned "we will remain civil" during their presentation, as they had already been cornered in the parking lot.

Jim spoke to a friendly crowd for a half hour, then took questions. Jim gave a blue-bin demonstration, and provided handouts. Highlights included: we can ask for a 2nd blue bin; we should just trash hard-to-clean glass jars, like peanut butter or mayonnaise (environmentally, it takes more resources to clean them than we'll save by recycling). 40% of all household trash is paper, so you can do your part for the environment by simply recycling newspapers, letters, and colored inserts.

Interestingly, only plastic bottles with "necks" can be recycled – no other plastics. Thin plastic salad bar tops, or plastic covers for cakes or carryout dinners should be trashed as they are not recyclable.

RCAers questions concerned their trashcans, that get banged up and end up everywhere and anywhere. Jim assured us that County reps follow the contractors during pickups, and monitor their work. Cans are re-stacked properly, but the wind blows the empty cans around, and kids after school and others think nothing of putting trash in your can, displacing them. RCAers were skeptical, but gave them a round of applause as they left.

The first order of business was a Randolph Road update. Kevin passed out legal-sized blueprints of the Montrose Parkway West, a project that may start in about 3 years. It involves radical changes for Montrose/ Randolph Road, but the work stops at Randolph and Parklawn.

Kevin's concern was Randolph Road from Parklawn through RCA-land, to the Rock Creek Park bridge. Will it also be radically changed or widened? The traffic engineer responsible for the project, who Kevin had spoken to previously, said "I doubt it." Randolph Road may have "spot" improvements (which aren't so minor to RCAers), such as widening it from five lanes to six, but no "major" improvements.

One of the cheaper Montrose Parkway alternatives was to simply flatten houses and widen Montrose Road to nine lanes! The engineers rejected this idea, because it's not very cost-effective. Stoplights, turn lanes, and cars turning onto a road slow down the traffic flow too much.

According to this traffic engineer, a better alternative would be to extend the limited-access Montrose Parkway "East," which would run behind the U-haul (across from Loehmann's Plaza), behind RCA-land's Franklin Park and Montrose Park neighborhoods, over Rock Creek, and end at Veirs Mill Road.

Kevin also mentioned upcoming roadwork of passing interest to RCA residents: at Rockville Pike and Strathmore Ave, and at Georgia Ave. and Randolph.

Treasurer Richard Zierdt introduced a minor RCA Bylaw change, that would suggest that "major" RCA resolutions be printed in the *Echo* newsletter before a General Membership vote is taken. Presently, important votes can be suggested and voted on without such prior notification. Passed by majority voice-vote: That Article IV, Section 9, of the RCA Bylaws include the clause "and/or whether such resolution or recommendation requires prior publication in the *Echo*."

The President brought up the last agenda business items to discuss and vote on: the Inter-county Connector (ICC); a feasibility study for the 2nd Potomac River Bridge; and the White Flint Conference Center. Kevin explained that previously, we never bothered to vote on such grandiose projects outside the outside the realm of RCA-land. Why bother if the RCA cannot change it?

Recently, however, our Treasurer testified directly before the County Council, and realized he could not express the RCA's views on the ICC or the 2nd Bridge Crossing because we never asked RCAers what they thought.

For this reason, the RCA was now going to vote on these issues. Kevin reminded members that RCA influence

is very limited, the vote outcome carried little weight, and hoped we would not get too excited about the issues.

After some discussion and minor debate, Passed by majority voice-vote: the RCA supports the construction of the ICC. Passed by majority voice-vote: the RCA supports a feasibility study for the construction of a 2nd Potomac River bridge. The vote on the White Flint Conference Center was dropped because construction is scheduled to start, so such a vote would be superfluous.

The meeting ended early with punch, great cake, and cookies provided by the RCA Homemakers!







Are You Aware of Your Air?


