As of November 3, 2007, the balance in the RCA checking account was \$11,443.26. Income for the period totaled \$12,700.93 thanks mainly to the many RCA members who have sent in their dues, donations, bulb orders and Sam's Club card payments. All member checks received through November 1 have been deposited and are reflected in the figures below.

Outflows for the period amounted to \$4,120.56. Two checks have been issued as deposits for work on the new Franklin Park sign. Several checks have been reserved for the payment of Sam's Club accounts: those check numbers are missing from the register below and will appear next month after the amounts are known.

Minutes of the RCA Executive Meeting

November 1, 2007

RCA President Mike Saunders deviated from the meeting agenda, for an update on the new Civic Association sign to be built at Randolph Road and Hunters Lane for the Franklin Park neighborhood. More good news! On behalf of the RCA, Mike signed 2 contracts: to build the sign stone columns; and for the wooden cross-piece. Adding solar lighting was suggested. Shaul was given a \$600 check for a down payment on a contract. Shaul raised enough money for the sign, with a little left over for a bottle of champagne to be used at the ribbon-cutting ceremony, the Saturday after Thanksgiving (November 24, 2007).

The Execs discussed and voted on RCA'er Edward Shaw's marketing offer to the RCA. Ed is a representative of 5LINX, an on-line marketing company offering the RCA the opportunity to benefit from "click-throughs" – on-line users who use an RCA website link to buy good and services, thus generating an RCA commission payment. Passed by majority voice-vote: the RCA rejects this offer, because of its \$95 annual fee. However, RCA is open to advertising on its website, and will continue to explore such revenue-generating commissions.

Mike turned to our efforts to save the RCA Recreation Center, in Randolph Hills Local Park, at the intersection of Ashley and Macon. Montgomery County Park and Planning ("Parks") plans on demolishing it! Previously, the Execs debated whether we should even allow Parks to address RCA'ers at the General Meeting on December 6, 2007.

The Execs believe Parks have already decided to demolish our Rec Center, and are now instigating a PR campaign to smooth over civic opposition. County Councilman Roger Berliner will be our guest speaker, so the Execs hope RCA'ers will loudly complain about Parks in his presence.

The Execs hope you read the Gazette newspaper 11/14/07 article on Recreation Centers that quoted 3 RCA'ers in opposition to Parks plan. It demonstrates our opposition campaign is bearing fruit. The Execs discussed Parks' use of appraisers, skewed data, and utilization rates.

Treasurer Dell Pillers/Cline projected a RCA/RFC fiscal year-end deficit of approximately \$1,700. The Execs reviewed the budget for contingency cuts, but no progress was made. Mike suggested tabling the debate on budget cuts until the budget picture became clearer.

Secretary Kline provided a copy of the just-available Montgomery County Public Schools Capital Investment Program (CIP FY 2009 - 2014). The CIP sections for the Walter Johnson Cluster and the Downcounty Consortium (Wheaton) were reviewed and discussed. ■

[The RCA will give any resident who experiences a problem with their RCA / Sam's Club account, attributable to the RCA, a free year of Sam's Club membership. However, in this particular case, while the caller did renew caller's RCA membership, the caller did not renew caller's RCA/Sam's Club account, so it was deleted. Usually when only the RCA membership is renewed, it is assumed that the member does not want Sam's anymore. In a few other cases, residents paid too late, so their accounts were also revoked. All of the above problems will be resolved without any resident paying more than the normal fee for a Sam's Club card (the RCA Guarantee), but please, folks, renew your RCA membership on time so we can avoid problems like this from the start. By the way, caller handled the situation correctly by paying for another card so that caller could shop that day knowing that the RCA would make it right later.] 🔳

Passed by unanimous voice-vote: RCF will sponsor Boy Scout Troop 1083, with budgeting and funding considerations to be consistent with the past RCA/RCF financial support. The RCF will sponsor a new Boy Scouts of America (BSA) initiative, for boys and girls ages 14-21, in highadventure and career opportunity activities. Passed by unanimous voice-vote: RCF will sponsor BSA Venturing Crew 1083, with budgeting and funding considerations to be voted upon separately.

George asked, what is the status of the RCF educational brochures to be developed and printed? Karen Helfert reported that work continues, but not much to report presently. Karen is also webmaster, and is creating an RCF website. Technical internet issues were discussed.

The next topic was the new RCF bylaws. The Execs hope to have a final draft, jointly reviewed and ready for approval, by the December 6th meeting. Finally, a Conflict of Interest statement was reviewed, discussed and approved. Passed by unanimous voice-vote: To accept the Conflict of Interest statement as written, with the word "corporation" replaced with "foundation," as our counsel deems most appropriate. ■

Giving to Charity?

Watch Where Your Money's Going

When you give to a charity, how do you know your money is being well-spent and in the spirit of furthering the work of that charity? The truth is, you probably don't know, and very few people do. However, there is a web site that tracks many charitable organizations for their giving sources, and how charities spend the money entrusted to it.

One company that rates non-profits is Charity Navigator (CN) and its website is www.charitynavigator.org. Using it, you can get financial summary reports on hundreds of large non-profit, usually 501(c)(3) organizations, and see how their donated money is being spent. I used to be a 100+ annual member of the Phillips Collection, a fine art gallery in Washington. However, when I found out using CN that Phillips' president is paid over 300K per year, I did not renew my membership.

CN's president, Trent Stamp, is also a lively writer whose essays on philanthropy always cause pause for thought. His essays are posted on the website.

Here are some topics discussed on the website:

- Evaluating Charities Not Currently Rated by Charity Navigator
- Tax Benefits of Giving
- Guide To Donating Your Car
- Guide to Donating Noncash Items
- Guide To Volunteering

- A Donor's Bill of Rights

And there are many more!

CN takes a reasonable approach to giving and the organizations supported by public donations. All non-profits have some overhead, even if just postage costs (such as the RCA and RCF). But exorbitant salaries earned in the name of charity bothers some people, and I'm one of them.

CN does not have the resources to evaluate all non-profits, so it limits itself to the larger ones, typically with budgets over \$500K. So it will be a while before the Randolph Civic Foundation is evaluated! ■


