Sam's Club Membership Update

OK – it's done. All *new* Sam's requests were finally fulfilled on January 21 (at 7 AM!). As I write this (January 22), not all new requestors have been notified, but I do a bunch every evening (email addresses help). I apologize for the delay. All *existing* RCA/SAM's cards were renewed in early November, 2002, so there should have been no problem with those. Let me know if you had any. (Some existing RCA/SAMers still have not paid for their Sam's renewal. When I had a doubt about a member, I did not delete their card – yet. Please pay up!)

As a goodwill gesture, since new card requestors did not have use of their cards for several months, new accounts issued this year will be good through October 31, 2004. Check the expiration date of your card(s) when you receive your RCA membership renewal form this September. If it's good through 2004, do not pay the \$30 Sam's fee. *However, RCA membership dues are still required.*

Why get a business Sam's Club card through the RCA? Because it's \$5 less than a regular Sam's membership, *and* you can shop Monday through Saturday during Sam's extended "business" hours of 7 AM - 10 AM. Regular hours begin at 10 am Monday through Friday, and 9:30 am Saturday. Sunday hours are the same (10am - 6 pm).

One important note about credit cards: Sam's does *not* take Mastercard, Visa, or American Express. I've heard it takes Discover. I know it takes cash, check, and ATM (debit) cards. The problem is exacerbated by the practice that the customer is not informed of this until checkout, when a cart full of merchandise has been collected!

The Kensington Volunteer Fire Department (KVFD) operates four fire stations in the greater Kensington, Wheaton, Veirs Mill and Leisure World areas. Together, these four stations protect a population of over two hun-

dred thousand residents and respond to greater than sixteen thousand emergency calls for service each year. The County Executive's appointed fire administrator, Gordon Aoyagi, has begun to make dangerous changes to the fire and rescue services provided throughout Montgomery County. KVFD will be adversely affected by the proposed changes.

In a move aimed at dismantling the community volunteer fire and rescue departments, the County Fire Administrator is proposing to close the Kensington Volunteer Fire Department's Station 21, cut fire and emergency medical services at several other community stations and strip away critical administrative operations support. These actions are being cast by the Fire Administrator as cost saving measures. However, his actions are deceiving, as the budget will actually increase by the creation of new and costly non-essential programs and job positions.

This betrays the trust and will of the community by manipulating the budget in order to seek complete organizational takeover, defeating the lawfully established public-private partnership that is already successfully in place. The Kensington Volunteer Fire Department condemns these proposals and asks for your assistance.

Here's how you can help . . .

Call the Montgomery County Executive, Douglas M. Duncan, at 240-777-2500, and the President of the Montgomery County Council, Michael Subin, at 240-777-7900. Tell them the following four things:

- First, closing stations in our community, or any community, is not an acceptable solution.
- Second, listen to our community fire officials; they have objective and unbiased ideas for savings.
- Third, do not permit the firing of critical administrative operations support staff; leave our community-based system intact.
- And finally, express your support for the publicprivate partnership and its continued growth and strength through community participation, with KVFD as a full partner in all levels of decision making.

Six years ago, citizen support defeated a referendum that sought to create a single government fire service. Your support now is critical to maintain this community-based system, intact and in place today.

Treasurer's Report



As of January 24, 2003, combined RCA+RCF assets total \$12,209.54. Some RCAers did not renew their Sam's cards, so Sam's gave the RCA a refund (in cash!) for deleted accounts (see January 22 transaction below). 



As for back yard pickup which we used to have, County Executive Doug Duncan can be thanked for that. Rather than have a public debate about it, he made the change buried in the County budget he submitted to the County Council, which is several hundred pages long. No one would have noticed it, and no one did. We used to have twice-a-week pickup as well. However, our property taxes were reduced \$50/year. Was it worth it? Not in my opinion. Yes, the RCA could definitely hire its own contractor if it were a municipality (I won't discuss that further in this note!) and we might be able to do so even as an Association. Like many things in the County, there is a "process," but I'm not sure what that is right now. I invite anyone interested in this idea to pursue it. In the meantime, I appreciate the caller's tenacity and thank caller for caller's efforts.]

On one hand, the County's website (www.montgomerycountymd.gov) says "Sorry, our mattress recycling program has been discontinued." However, at another spot it describes "Special Collections" which do accept mattresses using the same method as just described: "call 240-777-6410 no later then 9:30 a.m. on the business day BEFORE your collection day to schedule a pick up."]

"Mark's Bench" Graces "Mark's Park"

Another bench has been installed in Waverly-Schuylkill Park, but it doesn't match the other benches already there. The new rosewood bench is a memorial to Mark Edward Shore from his parents, S. Frank and Josephine P. Shore of Troy Road, and the Shore family.

Mark died of complications from multiple sclerosis in 1998 at the age of 36, and his bench was dedicated on November 24, 2002, the eve of the fourth anniversary of Mark's death, in a short ceremony attended by about 75 friends, neighbors, and relatives of Mark and his family. The ceremony began with a blessing offered by Fr. Joseph Perkins, associate pastor at Holy Cross Church in Garrett Park, and was followed by a couple of short speeches and nice refreshments. It was a beautiful day and a very touching event.

It is fitting that Waverly-Schuylkill Park is the location for the bench as it really was Mark's park. He was frequently seen going up and down the trail in his wheelchair, and the establishment of the park can be credited to his family's efforts to make it easier for him to get out of the house. The bench sits at the Schuylkill Road entrance to the park where it gets sun in the early morning and late afternoon but shade in the middle of the day. The landscaping immediately around the bench was designed and installed by Dennis Hernandez of Troy Road, Patrick Gilchrist of Forest Glen, and Lester Bollinger of Ashley Drive, with the help of others.

Mark Shore was diagnosed with MS in 1982, but he did not allow the disease to hold him back. After graduating from Montgomery College in 1985, Mark served as commissioner of the Montgomery County Commission on People with Disabilities from 1988 to 1995. He also

worked with the National Multiple Sclerosis Society for ten years. His family has continued to work with and support the society, organizing the Mark Shore Memorial Team to participate in society events. Frank Shore, a former state senator who represented District 17 from 1971 to 1990, was recently honored by the national capital chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society for his efforts to raise awareness of this disease as well as funds to help find a cure.

This memorial bench was arranged through the Montgomery Parks Foundation, a public nonprofit organization founded in 1992 to help fund park and open space needs in Montgomery County working in cooperation with The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission and the Montgomery County Department of Park and Planning. The foundation's memorial program allows anyone to dedicate a bench or tree to the memory of a loved one, and they work with you and the county to find an appropriate location for your memorial. Frank

learned about the program on Father's Day in 2002 when he picked up a copy of the foundation's newsletter while visiting the Black Hills Regional Park in Boyds, and he and Josie decided that this was the best way to honor their son's life. All of us who walk through the park will certainly appreciate their gift.



Zoning News

White Flint Golf Park

Several civic associations, including Garrett Park Estates and the Parkwood Residents Association of Kensington, are opposed to Metro's plan to develop the White Flint Golf Park. Metro plans to allow a private company (LCOR) to develop the 32.4 acres around and over the White Flint Metro Station into a huge development \$625 million development.

The civic associations say that Rockville Pike is already gridlocked, and that the developer is assuming more commuters will take Metro than is reasonable. Also, there are not enough open spaces for pedestrians in the development.

Target comes to Montrose Crossing.

Target will build a "big box" store behind RCA-land's Giant food store, next to the railroad tracks. Nebel Road is also to be extended, north of Randolph Road along the RR tracks, and intersect with Bou Ave at the parking garage. Previously, a Home Depot was going to be built at this location, but they backed out of the deal.

Don't get us wrong, the RCA executives like Target – Home Depot, too. Our concern is that if this project were slightly to the north, within the Rockville city limits, it would be banned. In year 2000, Rockville enacted a "big box" ban of stores of more than 65,000 sq ft.

Now, Rockville councilmembers and Mayor Larry Giammo are steamed because this Target is being built right outside the city limits. Giammo said he is "phenomenally concerned" about increased traffic (and so is the RCA!).

Strathmore Road Narrows

The County Planning Board (MCPPC) has voted to narrow Strathmore Avenue in RCA-land's next door neighbor Garrett Park, from the present 28 ft wide to 24 ft. The purpose is to slow traffic. Mandatory Referral #02811-SHA-1 will construct 5-ft sidewalks and street trees on both sides of Strathmore. Crosswalks will be made of pavers, and some private parking pads and turnarounds will be provided.


White Flint Conference Center

The White Flint Conference Center & Hotel is/was tentatively scheduled to start this spring. The 225-room hotel across from the White Flint Metro Station was held up in court for more than two years because of a resident's concern that the center will cause massive traffic on Rockville Pike.

This development is to feature the largest ballroom – 23,000 square feet – in the Maryland and Virginia sub-

It's the Law! Shovel Your Sidewalk!

The County will begin enforcing a new ordinance requiring residents (that means you!) to shovel the sidewalk in front of their house. The Pedestrian Winter Safety Act requires residents to shovel sidewalks within 24 hours of the storm's end, or face a \$50 fine. The elderly and disabled can call 240-777-2600 for volunteer shovelers.

Howard and Prince George's counties also have such laws. In Loudoun County, residents have six hours to shovel their walks after the snowfalls ends, or face a \$250 per day fine. Northern cities, like Pittsburgh, have had such laws for years. The parents of school-age children were the motivating force in getting this law enacted.

Is Your Landlord Neighbor Legal?

Montgomery County requires all property owners that rent out their houses (including those in RCA-land) to have licenses. Owners without licenses can be fined \$500. The license year runs from July 1 until June 30. Fees range from \$35 to \$95.

urbs and the third-largest in the area, says Kelly Groff, executive director of the Conference and Visitors Bureau of Montgomery County. Montgomery County's largest ballroom now is 7,000 square feet, at the Hyatt Regency Bethesda.

The development is a joint project of Montgomery County, the state of Maryland and D.C.-based Quadrangle Development Corp. It includes 36,000 square feet of walled meeting space, 20,000 square feet of public corridors for registration and exhibits, and the 225-room Marriott hotel, which is expandable to 450 rooms. Presently the 12-acre lot that will house the hotel and conference center is the White Flint Metro parking lot, on the eastside of Rockville Pike.

White Flint Office Development

The RCA executives have sent a letter to the County opposing a proposed 30% reduction in required parking spaces for the White Flint Office Development. This project is now to be built on the east side of Rockville Pike, just north of the White Flint Golf Park (driving range). We feel parking and traffic are bad enough in RCA-land, without loosening the zoning already in place.

RCA Treasurer Richard Zierdt wrote "There is currently insufficient parking within North Bethesda in general, and along Rockville Pike in particular, and yet the request seeks a 30% reduction in the amount of required parking capacity." RCA Exec George Gadbois attended a hearing on November 17th, and testified on behalf of the RCA against granting waiver loosening the parking space requirements.

Then a funny thing happened. The developers' lawyers called Richard, and said they were going to file a new "plan" that reduces the number of parking spaces they need.

The County's Department of Permitting Services (DPS), after hearing our testimony, did not decide the developer's zoning waiver request one way or another. Instead, they "punted" and returned the whole development package back to Park and Planning.

The RCA execs do not understand this action. Why did we bother to testify against the parking waiver, if no decision was going to be made? It appears to us that the DPS postponed the decision once they ran into community opposition. Returning the development package back to Park and Planning takes everything back to square one, and gives the developers a second chance, either to come up with a more acceptable plan, or to simply wear community activists like us down. The RCA may invite the developers to present their side at an upcoming RCA meeting.
