Minutes of the RCA General Meeting

December 7, 2006

RCA vice-president Mike Saunders calls the meeting to order at 8:05 pm. Guest: Mr. Brett Linkletter, Montgomery County Tree Manager for Montgomery County. Mr. Linkletter reports that several residents have called about trees from this area (RCA). The County budget for tree maintenance is \$40K - \$60K per year. There are 500,000 trees in Montgomery under County maintenance. Starting with the July 1 fiscal year for 2006-07, there is a \$4M budget: half for emergency removals, and half for the Block Pruning Program, where a community, such as the RCA, has its entire neighborhood pruned. The County will inspect every tree in the community and will take appropriate action. Requests for such service go back as far as 1997, which is why trees were given such a large increase in funding this year. Tree limbs are pruned that block pedestrians on sidewalks. Trees under power lines are given appropriate scrutiny. [Note: The RCA Executive Committee subsequently asked to be included in this program, and such service will begin in the fall, 2007.] For the planting of new trees, which is a separate program from tree pruning, small maples may be planted under power lines, which grow to no taller than 25-30' high. The County has a directive to achieve 50% canopy coverage. Currently there is 39% canopy coverage. The County owns the right-of-way between the sidewalk and the street, and this area must be used to achieve this goal. A tree planted every 40' is desirable. The County is trying to get away from maple trees. Instead, White Oaks are used, Black Gum, Seedless Sweet Gum, and Beeches, if they can find them. Tree roots in the sewer are the homeowners's responsibility. Every County has a Forest Conservancy Board, which answers to the big board in Annapolis. Tree service is completely request-driven. Any resident can report tree problems. Get a TM number if you do: the Tree Maintenance number.

Minutes. Minutes from the October General Meeting are approved. Treasurer Dell Pillers/Cline Treasurer's Report is accepted as printed in the December *Echo*.

Committee Reports. Membership. John Kehoe. The RCA has 511 paid members. \$487 was donated specifically for the Franklin Park sign.

White Flint Sector Plan. Dan Hoffman (who is a citizen member on this County planning advisory group). There was a December 12 meeting, with more to follow. Matt Tifford is also on the committee. Committee Chair Mary Rivkin is willing to address the RCA if it chooses. This committee is expected to last six months, and will offer planning suggestions as the White Flint area is further developed.

Committee on Governmental Options. Matt Tifford. This committee has four members, and is looking for a couple more. Antonia Mazza offers to join, on the spot! Welcome!

RCA Officers. Richard Zierdt moves that Mike Saunders, George Gadbois, and Dan Hoffman be RCA president, 1st VP, and 2nd VP, respectfully. Seconded. Passes unanimously. Richard, who will no longer be on the executive committee after about 20 years, says there is life after the RCA. He will remain involved in committee work, however.

Environment. Matt Tifford. Winding Creek Park has reopened, and it is "gorgeous." Unlicensed contractor is moving; house is for sale.

9:18 pm, meeting is adjourned. ■


As of January 5, 2007, the balance in the RCA checking account was \$8,752.09.

Mr. Tifford left out the fact that a 12year old boy was killed crossing Strathmore Avenue because Pepco (electric company) turned off the lights because the electric bill was not paid by the State or the Town of Garrett Park.
