President's Message

Happy New Year! 2008 promises to be a most interesting year for RCA. Lets take a look at things left over from 2007 which will impact RCA during the coming year. First there is the Randolph Hills Rec Center. As an update, I was invited to inspect the sills of the current Randolph Hills Rec Center. The sill plates of the building are rotted and flaking apart from a combination of moisture and probably termites or carpenter ants. I took a couple of photos of the damage and this is what I saw. Where the wood of the building walls meets the concrete floor, the wood is falling apart. That tells me our Recreation Center is probably going to meet a bulldozer in the near future. The current building may be too expensive to repair. Let's face it, the building served us for 50 years without any appreciable maintenance and now needs to be replaced.

I provided the Park and Planning representative Mark Wallis with some ideas about a replacement with a pre-fabricated steel building, similar to those you hear about on the radio. One of the vendors provides a nice building that could be procured and installed in the place of our current Rec Center for about the same costs as a proper repair job on our building. In as much as the current building is not viable for use as a rec center any more, why not insist that a reasonable replacement be provided. This build-

ing would serve our needs for at least another 50 years and is actually warranted for 45 years, to boot.

Since our current building at 1320 square feet is considered too small to be engender much rental use by the county, I recommended a larger building be installed with both heat and air conditioning. Something on the order of 2400 square feet of floor space would be more viable to increased usage as a space for community meetings, parties and classes, etc. The scouts would enjoy being able to use the building for activities when the schools are closed and they are excluded from using the school building.

In order to ensure a "green footprint" I recommended to Park and Planning that the heat and A/C be "on-demand" for temperatures above (or below) minimal temperatures set to prevent damage to building utilities such as water freezing. This could be done with timers. Lights could be controlled either using a timer or ultrasonic motion detectors.

What I'm trying to say is that we, the RCA, need to keep pressure on the County Parks and Recreation and encourage the County Council to not just demolish our Rec Center but to replace it with a new building that will serve us well over the next 50 years.

Since my last column in the *Echo*, we've seen the completion of the Franklin Park sign that has been the subject of numerous articles over the last 4 or 5 years. Patrick Sign employees Gyimah Emmanuel and Josh Wright put the finishing touches on the new sign. As mentioned in the November *Echo*, our neighbor, Cornel Stana of Ertter Drive, and his crew from Corad Pavers placed the sign posts and completed that part of the work. We are still trying to decide on the best way to effectively light the sign given the budget (none) and technology available. We will figure that out before long and the sign will be visible even at night.

Not wasting any time, Dell Pillers/Cline, Shaul Kopyto and Mike Saunders cut the ribbon to inaugurate the new Franklin Park Sign on the Saturday after Thanksgiving. Again, thanks to everyone who contributed including two people I didn't mention in the December *Echo* article, Steven Martinez and Edward Bruder, for their contributions to the sign. Thanks to Shaul Kopyto for being trail boss on getting the sign done.

RCA-Land was greeted by Santa on December 23. I got to ride along as Santa's guest on his fire truck and joined in with the Scouts including the Cub Scout Pack's Webelos Den, RCA's Boy Scout Troop, RCA's Venture Crew and RCA's Girl Scout Troop, going though the neighborhood and putting a big smile on the faces of a lot of youngsters in RCA-land. One of our Boy Scout leaders, Greg Skolnik, snapped this photo (at right) of Santa with one of my grandsons during his visit to the neighborhood. 



Happy New Year to all! As we enter the more severe time of the winter season weather-wise, additional caution and concern is advised. For safety's sake, and as you hear repeated each year about this time, please keep those sidewalks (as well as your own front door stoop) clear of snow and ice. Having a carbon monoxide detector will alert you if there is malfunction with your gas appliances such as your furnace. Check smoke detector operation and change the batteries. Turn off your outside water spigot from the inside and do not thaw frozen pipes with an open flame.

As mentioned in the last *Echo*, many places accept your second-hand clothing and blankets, as well as food donations, for the less fortunate. This generosity is especially appreciated when the weather is harsh. Take particular care for your own sake in freezing temperatures by keeping an extra coat or blanket in the car, dressing yourself and your children appropriately for the weather and be mindful of pets that normally spend a lot of time outside.

Finally, be sure your car is ready for winter. Tires need good tread, anti-freeze should be checked and changed if necessary, the battery needs to be in good shape, and ice scrapers and jumper cables should be handy. Also, slow down and watch for pedestrians and other cars when road conditions are questionable. Use headlights in bad weather.

On an educational note, several members and officers are engaging in dialog with MCPS relative to capacities of our community schools, particularly Viers Mill. Viers Mill is still performing well, but there is concern about overcrowding in the near future based on the County statistician's figures.
