Minutes of the RCA General Meeting

May 3, 2002

President Kevin Kline opened the lightly attended meeting by announcing the yard sale May 11th. He offered congratulations to graduating Wheaton and Walter Johnson High School Seniors.

Kevin informed RCA Park Chairman Frank Rossomondo that the Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC), in responding to his letter regarding our problems with unruly persons using our soccer fields, are apparently backtracking on some of the promises they made to us verbally.

The President then welcomed our guest speaker, Josh Gibson, a representative of Flexcar. Josh explained that Flexcar is a car-sharing company working with Metro. Flexcar rents cars and pickup trucks from Metro parking lots by the hour. There are several pricing schemes. The base plan is members pay a one-time \$25 fee, then rent a car for \$7 per hour. This \$7 price includes gas, insurance, and maintenance. Presently there are only two cars available at RCA-land's White Flint Metro. Josh spoke for 20 minutes, passed out pamphlets, and was given a round of applause.

Kevin presented the slate of candidates for RCA's leaders. These are only suggestions, but the RCA membership must elect new officers at the June 6th general meeting. RCA'ers are encouraged to vote. Anyone can run for office, and in a healthy democracy, we would have true contests. Unfortunately, the RCA has too few volunteers. We need fresh ideas. If you'd like to spend even a little time on the RCA, we will find you a place!

Kevin had no new information regarding the animals, including a red fox, that had been poisoned in the Randolph/Galena/Hunters Road area last Christmas. This was reported extensively in the May *Echo*. Nonetheless, Kevin provided copies of the State of Maryland's Toxicology Report and briefly read from it. We can only assume the poisoning, caused by an off-the-shelf pesticide, was accidental. No new poisonings have been reported. RCA'ers must be careful when using pesticides and insecticides around the house!

RCA Director, Cubmaster, and RCA Education Committee member George Gadbois gave an update of RCA-land education. Most importantly, Montgomery County is now receiving a massive infusion of school funding from the State of Maryland. George reported that this will directly affect one of RCA-land's High Schools, Wheaton. See the article on page 15 of this *Echo* for a complete school report.

Kevin then discussed the sewage work planned for Rock Creek Park. See the article in the May *Echo* for complete details.

Finally, Vice-president Matt Shore promised to find out when the last section of RCA-land sidewalks (behind Boiling Brook) would be re-built. Since the County is hurting for funds with the economic recession, we want to ensure they finish our sidewalks.

The floor was opened to new business, and small informal discussions took place. Kevin gave out blueprint copies of extensive roadwork planned for our area (ending at Randolph and Parklawn). Kevin also passed out a month-old list of convicted sex offenders that live or work in this area. For once, the meeting ended early.

SAM's Club Reducing Hours

SAM's Club, at least at its Gaithersburg store, no longer has "Gold Key Shopping" hours (from 7 AM to 10 AM). The store now opens at 10 AM, and closes at 8:30 PM, Monday through Friday. Saturday's hours are from 9:30 AM to 8 PM; Sunday from 11 AM to 6 PM. The "Gold Key" hours were for business members, which all RCA/SAM's members are. "Regular" SAM's members could not shop during those hours.

The form letter I received said the store was reducing hours "due to our upcoming club remodel." No word yet on whether or not the extended hours would be restored after "remodeling."

The RCA, as a service to its members, offers SAM's Club cards at a discount. This program will continue

until at least November 1, 2003. SAM's raised its "business class" fees, but the RCA extended its memberships with SAM's at the lower rate. We will re-evaluate (and possibly re-negotiate) SAM's pricing at that time, still well over a year away.

Boy Scout Troop 1083 Web Page

Usually, Boy Scout news comes from the Boy Scouts and their leaders. But the RCA sponsors Troop 1083 – the RCA "owns" it, as we say. The following proposal extends the RCA's support of the Troop.

Our Boy Scouts have several new boys who have started this year (graduating from Cub Scouts), as well as new adult leadership. Mr. Jeff Dahn comes to us with web experience and is willing to maintain a site for the Troop with its own URL (that basically means an easy-to-remember web site name). As RCAers already know, a web site adds considerable visibility and a certain prestige to any organization. As with any children growing up these days, all the positives we can provide our boys should be considered.

So, I'm proposing that the RCA fund the acquisition of a URL for Boy Scout Troop 1083, and provide for an internet service provider (ISP) as long as the Troop maintains the site. Mr. Dahn will do this, so I think we've got a good fit. The cost of the URL registration (for Troop1083.org) is \$175 for 10 years, and the ISP costs \$16 per month (\$192/year). In addition (or subtraction), because the Troop would use the same ISP that the RCA uses, the RCA's ISP cost will be reduced from \$18 to \$16 per month.

Basically, this amounts to a \$200 donation to support our Scouts. It's money well spent. We couldn't even begin to pay for the time and effort that the many adult volunteers provide now for free to support, mentor, encourage, and supervise camping trips for our kids.




News from Pack 1081


Wheaton High School and Downcounty Consortium Update

Montgomery County State Senators were able to secure a massive infusion of new school funding for the support of smaller learning communities. Nearly \$1 million of the approximate \$1.3 billion secured will go toward the Downcounty Consortium initiative, of which Wheaton High School is a part. Wheaton High School will unveil its Academy of Technology in the fall of 2003. Strands of this academy will be focused around themes of Biotechnology/Medical Careers, Engineering Technology, and Information Technology. As a gateway experience, all incoming 9th grade students will begin their Wheaton High School Academy of Technology experience as part of a 9th Grade Academy. This 9th grade academy will be composed of cohorts of students who will be under the tutelage and guidance of a select team of instructors who can focus together on the whole student to ensure not only ninth grade success, but also preparedness for the technology strands. An exploratory course will be designed to introduce them to the rigorous coursework and the specific technology strands Wheaton has to offer. Each academy will provide a more personalized smaller learning community in our school that is devoted to offering excellent and rigorous curriculum to students of all abilities as well as the opportunity to participate in meaningful hands-on and experimental activities which will enable them to make informed educational and career choices.

A complete timeline for consortium activities can be found on the MCPS Downcounty Consortium web site under the heading of Consortium Timeline. By the opening of school in September, all entering 9th grade students within the consortium will enter a high school in which they will be immediately connected to the adults within the school. First year students will be provided with structured opportunities to set goals, connect with

adults within the school and community, make interdisciplinary connections, and build a foundation for high school success.

At Wheaton High School, freshmen (425) will enter the Ninth Grade Academy, a school within a school. Each student will be assigned to a team of 100 to 110 students for that entire school year. Additionally, each student will be assigned to an advisor who will remain with that student over the four years of high school. The goal of this academy will be to prepare all students for the rigors of a career academy, and provide connections for these students into one of the Wheaton Academies of Technology for their remaining three years of high school.

As a result of this partnership, all entering freshmen within the consortium will enroll in a one-semester freshman seminar course, which will first and foremost deal with interest assessment and personal goal setting. This course, which is presently under development by a task force of consortium teachers will (1) support students in their transition from the middle school; (2) connect each student to the programs and practices of their high school; (3) introduce each student to the career and academic academies available in grades 10 to 12 within the consortium; and (4) result in the creation of an elec-



tronic portfolio that will serve as a roadmap for that student's next four years – the remaining three years of high school and the initial year of post-secondary activity.

The RCA's understanding is that this year 8th grade students WILL NOT be "choosing" a Consortium high school other than their own "home" cluster high school, i.e. WHS. Choice has been put off at least one year. However, the Signatures at WHS will be fully implemented as described above and on the Wheaton High School and Downcounty Consortium websites. The Board of Ed has, through the State-secured money mentioned above, been able to approve funding money for this program among others. This funding approval was mentioned recently in the April 24th Gazette. Also, next school year WHS will expand from the current three AP course offerings to thirteen. Looks like things are SLOWLY moving in the right direction.

Are You Aware of Your Air?

Gardening Tips

Gypsy moth caterpillar infestations erupt in June and build until early July, when the caterpillars will enter into a two-week resting stage. The caterpillars will then transform into moths and fly away. Gypsy moths will eat anything during an infestation. They may completely defoliate one or two nearby trees. Trees will survive one defoliation, but will succumb to repeated defoliations (three or four) in one season. Combat the caterpillars by wrapping a piece of folded burlap around tree trunks about waist-high. This stops and traps the caterpillars as they attempt to crawl up the trunk. Home Depot & Lowes offer several sprays.

moths) have exited their egg clusters and will weave silken tents in the crotches of trees. They will not go far until early June.

Then they will devour your foliage day and night. For high-up tents, poke a hole in the tent and direct a stream of water to break it apart and knock it down. A propane torch works best if you can reach the tent. Kill the remaining caterpillars.
