The tracks are a dangerous place for people to be. If you have children, remind them not to play near the tracks. We don't need another tragedy in our neighborhood.

As mentioned last month in the *Echo*, we will be hearing about the fate of our Recreation Center during the June RCA meeting. Mark Wallis and Kathy Dearstine from the Parks department will present the plans for Randolph Hills Neighborhood Park. This was originally scheduled as an Executive Board meeting but, I am declaring it an open and general meeting and hoping for a large attendance.

I've been riding my Harley and my scooter around the RCA-Land recently. If you see me, wave and say hi. Have a great summer – See you in September. ■

Parking Enforcement Update

After the "Education" Come the Tickets

Following up from the May RCA meeting, I received a call from Officer Cox of the Rockville Police District. His office handles traffic and parking enforcement.

Officer Cox explains that "education" is the best way to achieve effective compliance with traffic and parking laws. [I asked, rhetorically, why the residents of Ashley Drive did not receive such "education" before they were ticketed on March 11, but let's move on].

Officer Cox appreciates that the RCA publishes news about traffic and parking in the *Echo*, so that's the first step towards compliance ("education"). We talked about (1) blocked sidewalks, (2) commercial trucks parked in residential areas, (3) speeding school buses on Ashley Drive, and (4) cars running the stop sign at Boiling Brook/Rocking Horse. That's all I remembered off the top.

His response to my numbered comments:

- (1) Understood. He will educate or ticket as he sees it. I explained that this problem is pervasive.
- (2) He cannot ticket commercial trucks parked on private property, e.g., a driveway. And he is reluctant to ticket tow trucks because the driver may be on call and need the truck to do his job. However, he agreed that if two or more trucks are parked for the same business, then that's a likely violation. He agreed that commercial trucks are supposed to be parked in the driveway, however, if a property has no driveway, he's reluctant to ticket.
- (3) He feels that most school buses are driven slower than the average person believes they are travelling because their size and sound volume gives the impression that they are travelling faster than they are. He said he's given one ticket to a school bus driver in 15 years. Nonetheless, he noted our concern.
 - (4) He will do something about it.

Overall, he sounded interested in the problems we have and that he felt he could do something about.

Since then, several neighbors have commented, via the RCA's Yahoo Groups listserve, that school buses *do* speed on Ashley Drive, even given their larger size. If you notice a speeding school bus in RCA-land, please note its bus number and the time of day.

This is the last article about traffic and parking until the September/October *Echo*. Please drive safely. ■



County Council Budget Includes Randolph Hills

As reported in the May 21 Bethesda Gazette, that newspaper delivered free to every home in RCA-land, the Montgomery County Council approved a preliminary fiscal 2009 budget that includes \$1.15 million to repair and maintain recreation centers that faced closure. Randolph Hills Recreation Center was explicitly mentioned, along with four other parks. I believe Councilmember Nancy Floreen, who lives close by in Garrett Park, was instrumental in including this appropriation in the budget.

This does not necessarily mean our recreation center building, which is currently condemned, and which was used for decades by the RCA for our meetings, picnics, membership drives, and occasional projects, will be restored or replaced. It does mean there's more money to survey the situation, and that there is at least some Council interest to keep centers open for community use.

The RCA Executive Committee will be meeting with Park officials over the summer about this, and we will have more to report in the September Echo.



Minutes of the RCA General Meeting

May 1, 2008

RCA president Mike Saunders calls the meeting to order at 8:10 pm. Guests: Captain Daryl McSwain and Officer Daum from the Rockville Police District discuss gangs in general and in Montgomery County in particular. Members of two gangs have been identified in Randolph Hills, but Officers explain that gang members have been identified in all neighborhoods of Montgomery, even the "good" ones. Gangs known as Bloods and MS-13 exist in Montgomery. 68% of members are between 13 and 21. Youths who used to be influenced by their parents and church are finding identity in gangs. After their presentation, discussion ensued about traffic and parking enforcement, including speeding school buses on Ashley Drive. Captain McSwain took notes about our concerns, and also referred us to Sergeant Ivan Lankfort, who handles traffic issues. [Note: An Officer Cox contacted the RCA later on Sergeant Lankfort's behalf.]

After the presentation by Rockville police, our next guests were Perry Berman and Derek Berlage representing the developers of White Flint View. Mrsrs. Berman and Berlage described an "Urban Village" concept for the areas around Nebel Street and Nicholson, extending up to Rockville Pike. One idea presented was to build a MARC train station at Nicholson Court (the eastmost section of Nebel Street), with a footbridge connecting this station with Wyaconda Road (in RCA-land). Moved and seconded that the RCA support such a bridge and MARC station. Passes unanimously.

The treasurer noted that the RCA will be \$1500 short this year. Mr. Alan Kronstadt, owner of the Randolph Hills Shopping Center, offered to donate \$1000 to the RCA to help close the gap, and was graciously thanked. [Note: an anonymous donor later donated \$500]. ■

2008-04-22 (Tue) 1:00 pm Not Anonymous. Caller noticed that the restaurant next to Friends of the Library [in the Randolph Hills Shopping Center] has applied for a Class B alcoholic beverage license on-sale only. [Some years ago, a restaurant in Randolph Hills that offered live entertainment and sold liquor became a problem for nearby residents because of loud music at night and disorderly conduct. The police visited many times. When that restaurant's liquor license came up for renewal, the RCA, and the police department, opposed it. It was denied. Caller does not want to go through that again.]

2008-05-06 (Tue) 8:10 pm Not Anonymous. Caller is continuously receiving the *Echo* even though caller has requested numerous times that it stop being delivered to caller's house. If this is an issue, please call. [That's fine, however, if an issue comes up, such as the recent increased police enforcement of parking violations, caller will be at a disadvantage if caller is not aware of it.]

2008-05-07 (Wed) 4:43 pm Not Anonymous. Where does caller send \$5 for the community yard sale? [Pay at the yard sale. As it was, the sale was effectively cancelled because of rain. The "No-rain-date" policy will be reconsidered since the RCA must have continual insurance anyhow. The RCA used to pay for one-day insurance, so a rain date doubled the cost.]

2008-05-08 (Thu) 9:52 pm Not anonymous. Caller called Park Police back in March about all the trash on the soccer field [Randolph Hills local park] where the woods are. Heaps and heaps of trash. Caller called several times, but it finally got cleaned up. Caller talked to Park Police about coming by on the weekends and evenings to check out the

park, and in that conversation, the police said there were several older men that were hanging out there, and that they would keep an eye on it. If you notice what time the trash is left behind, the police can connect the time with the team that was playing and go after them about picking up their trash, and if they don't do it, they won't get permits to use the field. The problem is better, but caller still picks up a lot of trash on caller's walks with caller's dog. Also, given the traffic and speeding on Ashley Drive and Schuylkill Road, we have no designated crosswalks in this area, especially at Schuylkill and Boiling Brook Parkway where motorists can make the right turn onto Schuylkill without stopping - there's no crosswalk. Can we get these installed and maybe a few more stop signs to help slow down traffic. Caller notices that this has been done on Tilden Lane in Luxmanor to control speeding. Or maybe circles or bumps. Could this be addressed at the next RCA meeting? If people want to report trash, call 301-670-8080 non-emergency number, they handle maintenance. Thank you very much.

2008-05-09 (Fri) 3:37 pm Not anonymous, but in the Holiday Park neighborhood. Does the RCA have a list of young people in the community looking for park-time jobs, yard work, car wash, etc, who are available to help persons in

President's Pen

Memorial Day is much more than a three-day weekend that marks the beginning of summer. To many people, especially the nation's thousands of combat veterans, this day, which has a history stretching back all the way to the Civil War, is an important reminder of those who died in the service of their country.

Memorial Day was originally known as Decoration Day because it was a time set aside to honor the nation's Civil War dead by decorating their graves. It was first widely observed on May 30, 1868, to commemorate the sacrifices of Civil War soldiers. By the late 1800s, many communities across the country had begun to celebrate Memorial Day and, after World War I, observances also began to honor those who had died in all of America's wars.

In 1966, the federal government, under the direction of President Lyndon Johnson, declared Waterloo, N.Y., the official birthplace of Memorial Day. In 1971, Congress declared Memorial Day a national holiday to be celebrated the last Monday in May.

Today, Memorial Day is celebrated at Arlington National Cemetery with a ceremony in which a small American flag is placed on each grave. Also, it is customary for the president or vice-president to give a speech honoring the contributions of the dead and lay a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

This Memorial Day, take a moment from Bar-B-Qs, family gatherings and the like, and contemplate the contributions of our fallen servicemen without which we would not be enjoying the freedom we have today. Make an effort to display your American flag on Memorial Day weekend. Visit a veterans' cemetery or a war memorial. Thank a veteran for their service (the historical information above was taken in part from the history.com website).

Whether it's spring break or summertime, it's important for parents not to take a vacation from safety. While warmer weather means endless hours of sun and fun for kids, it's also an opportunity for both minor and serious injuries. In fact, summer is the most dangerous time of year for kids – nearly half of all unintentional injury-related deaths among children occur during the summer. This information and more can be found at http://www.getonboardwithsafety.com. Here are a few water-related tips from getonboardwithsafety.com:

- Parents should always supervise children around water and install fencing that completely surrounds all pools, spas, whirlpools and hot tubs. Pool fences should be at least five feet high and have self-latching gates.
- Know which of your child's friends and neighbors have pools. Make sure your child will be supervised by an adult while visiting.
- Children should learn to swim. Enroll them in swimming lessons taught by qualified instructors when they are ready, usually after age 4. If you don't know how to swim, enroll with your kids!
- Adults and kids over age 13 should learn infant and child CPR.
- Be aware of undercurrents and changing waves and undertows when at the ocean or a lake.
