Pedestrian Improvements on Randolph Road

One of the pedestrian safety issues we have been working on for a long time is the lack of a safe pedestrian crossing of Randolph Road at the intersection of Randolph Road and Hunters Lane. The problem at this intersection is that there are bus stops on either side of Randolph Road, so it is common for Ride-On Bus patrons to race across five lanes of traffic to get to one bus stop or the other. Currently, the only safe crossings are at Rocking Horse Road and Lauderdale Drive, each far enough away to cause frustration to anyone who needs to get to a bus stop that is

right there across the street. As a result, many people do cross Randolph Road at Hunters Lane, risking life and limb just to catch the next bus.

MCDOT has put together a plan to create a small pedestrian refuge just east of the Hunters Lane intersection. The purpose of the refuge is to provide a safe haven in the middle lane so that pedestrians only have to cross two lanes at a time instead of having to cross all five lanes in one mad dash. When we discussed this issue last year, there was some concern expressed that depending on its size and location, a pedestrian refuge might make it difficult for people to make left

turns at the intersection and also might cause problems getting in and out of driveways for people who live on that stretch of Randolph Road. The planners at MCDOT created this plan with those concerns in mind.

The RCA still has concerns about creating a false sense of security for pedestrians. The sight-lines for approaching eastbound traffic are very short, so both drivers and pedestrians will have limited time to become aware of one another. MCDOT's plans include signage to help alert drivers approaching the intersection of the crosswalk. We will be watching the construction so we can intervene if the signage does not appear to be sufficient. We have also requested orange crossing flags for pedestrians to carry as

Boiling Brook Traffic: Your feedback on 'Bump-outs' needed!

Many of you will probably remember the ruckus that ensued last year when workers from the Montgomery County Department of Transportation (MCDOT) built a concrete bump out on Boiling Brook Parkway just before the entrance to Charles E. Smith School. In that instance, County officials acted without soliciting the community for feedback, and then failed to adequately sign the new traffic pattern. As a result, several vehicles collided with the new concrete curb before adequate signage was finally installed. In addition to that concrete bump out, MCDOT also constructed other bump outs along Boiling Brook Parkway using temporary striping and plastic delineator posts.

Now that residents have had time to become accustomed to the new traffic patterns, MCDOT would like to build concrete bump outs in place of these temporary striped areas. In response, the RCA has informed MCDOT of some modifications that will need to be made if the concrete bump outs are built. Since built, several residents have complained that the current striping at the intersection of Rocking Horse and Boiling Brook makes it very difficult for large vehicles and vehicles with trailers to turn left from Rocking Horse Road onto Boiling Brook Parkway. We have passed on these complaints and requested that MCDOT redesign the footprint of this bump out to alleviate the problem.

Those of us who live on the north side of Randolph Road will now vote at the Rocking Horse Road Center, 4910 Macon Rd, Rockville MD, 20852.

Even if you live on the streets adjacent to Rocking Horse Road Center (Macon Road, Galena, Hunters, etc), you will not be able to vote there – you will have to go to Veirs Mill Local Park on Garrett Park Road.

Characteristics of Bus Rapid Transit Systems

Following the June Echo article on the possibility of Bus Rapid Transit coming to the RCA-Land region, the White Flint Partnership released a press release describing the characteristics of Bus Rapid Transit systems. At a recent forum hosted by the Coalition for Smarter Growth, Francine Waters, Executive Director of the White Flint Partnership and Senior Managing Director for Lerner Enterprises, said: "White Flint is ready and eager to serve as a model for the best rapid transit technologies available. Businesses, residents and county officials have endorsed this concept as a vital conduit that will enhance the coming transformation of the White Flint corridor."

BRT characteristics include:

Right of way: More separation from traffic than regular bus service, ranging from mixed-flow lanes to dedicated lanes to grade-separated transitways; Barrier / curb separation or bus lane markings such as pavement color, texture or design to help differentiate bus lanes from regular traffic.

Route Structure and operation: simple, direct routes; integrated with local and express bus networks; frequent service throughout the day.

Intelligent Transportation Systems (IRT): Transit signal priority modifies normal traffic signal operations (i.e. extended green lights) to allow BRT vehicles to move through intersections more easily; Vehicle tracking systems ensure arrivals are evenly spaced and allow for real-time arrival information.

Fare collection: Pre-boarding fare collection systems allow for simultaneous front and rear boarding; fare pricing can be integrated with other modes of public transport in the same network (i.e. offering discounts to passengers transferring to/from Metro).

Enhanced vehicles: High capacity vehicles with low floors and wide doors; distinct brand, logo, aesthetics; Integrate alternative fuels and advanced emissions

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Cheap Eats

With our busy schedules, we don't get to cook from scratch every day. Thank goodness, we can start our busy work week, or a homework-laden school night, with some convenient take-out or restaurant choices.

My list here is far from comprehensive, but I encourage you, Dear Reader, to post your own favorites on our Randolph Hills listserve. If you haven't signed up to our Yahoo group at www.Randolphca.com, do so now. Not only will you find neighbors' advice on baby sitting, dog walking, contractor references, traffic and emergency notifications, but also big-issue items like Montgomery County Council planning items.

Our newest local restaurant opening, Chef Geoff's at 12256 Rockville Pike, has a Monday special, with wine bottles at half price, in addition to their reasonably priced 3-course special at \$20. This is his fifth restaurant in the area, two in downtown DC, one in Virginia, and another one in Chevy Chase. If you remember the shuttered Irish-themed Againn, that's the location of the just-opened Chef Geoff's. The décor color scheme is lighter, with cream-colored table cloths and whitewashed woodwork, all a bit classier looking than the previous Brit-Pub style. We've seen quite a number of families with children eat there on an early Monday night. Along the walls are some of the familiar table booths that seat parties of two or four. Their separate bar section to the right is revamped, too, with the bar counter moved against the wall. That allows for a row of banquettes for added dining space. Right now, Chef Geoff's is running an all-Night Happy Hour on Monday and Tuesday. If you've received a postcard in the mail from them, you can get \$10 off until October 31. Otherwise, go on their website and download their \$10 certificate there.

One of our longest-running and beloved family eateries is Ambrosia Restaurant, located at 12015 Rockville Pike across from the Giant supermarket. I only eat there on Fridays, when they serve lima beans alongside the tremendous lamb shank (my favorite). But their Monday night special "Buy one pizza, get one free" is hard to beat. And their warm welcome and great service by their long-established and hardworking waiters lives up to the proverbial Greek hospitality. Ambrosia is open for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

For a healthy low-cal lunch or dinner, steamed right before your eyes, check out the food counter at MOM's, My Organic Market, in their new location on 5566 Randolph Road. After stocking up on all the healthy fruit and veggies you intend to prepare during the week, you can have a guilt-free snack or full meal with their bowls, wraps, and salads, all made to order. It's become a popular hangout for a lot of beautiful people. Probably a great hang to find a running buddy, exchange dog-walking tips, or trade some other natural beauty tips, all while waiting to have your electric car charged up again at the electric "pump" outside.

Of course, right next door is the gigantic Tyson's Buffet & Restaurant, billed as the largest of its kind in the DC area. It is truly an adventure! The industrial-sized kitchen cranks out fragrant loads of hard-core fabulous Chinese foods, apparently from all different regions and cuisines, Vietnamese specialties, fresh-prepared Japanese sushi, and some uninspired American food choices (but why bother with that). Lunch is a great deal, and even the dinner can't be beat with their all-you-can-eat offerings, from chicken feet to jellyfish. You may have seen busloads of diners alight on the busy parking lot, which indicates that this shopping center has turned into a thriving location. Gold's Gym helps you work off some of the calories.
