Traffic Update

Two additional Stop signs were installed at the intersection of Boiling Brook Parkway and Rocking Horse Road around July 18, 2026. The Stop signs create two three-way stop intersections. RCA reached out to MCDOT asking for background on this decision but has not heard back. Take caution when going through the intersection since some drivers may revert to old habits and mistakenly run the Stop signs.

Ashley Drive Speed Hump Plan

The Ashley Driver speed hump plan had overwhelming support among Ashley Driver residents. The concurrence forms were delivered to MCDOT in late June. MCDOT expects the speed humps to be installed by this October, weather and schedule permitting.

Treasurer's Report for RCA for June 2026

The beginning balance as of June 1, 2026, was \$13,263.56.

There was \$227.50 in membership fees and donations to the RCA and RCF, \$114.00 from the 50/50 Raffle from the Concert Series in June 2026, and \$1,000.00 donated to the RCA from the Pike District Partnership for the RCA Summer Concert Series.

Total revenue in June 2026 was \$1,341.50.

There were five expenses in June 2026: \$848.00 to Quick Printing for the May/June ECHO, \$523.04 to Inmark Media LLC for the delivery of the May/June 2026 ECHO, \$199.56 to Patrica Simonton for reimburse for purchasing the RCA Tablecloth for the membership table, \$200.00 to Leah Sneider of the 7 Beez and \$200.00 to Mark Nensel for the June 13, 2026 performance at the Civic Green for the RCA Concert Series.

Total expenses in June 2026 were \$1,971.50.

The ending balance as of June 30, 2026 was \$12,633.56. Please note that expenses for The Spin Cats for \$400.00 for their performance on June 20, 2026, and reimbursement of \$84.32 to Alison Dewey for expenses for mailing the Ashley Drive speed hump concurrence forms to MCDOT, printing colored Concert series promotional signs, plastic sleeves for posting the signs outdoors, and new membership forms were paid in July 2026 but are for Fiscal Year 2025-2026.

- RCF Donations - \$2,178.00 (this includes funds from Sign Replacement)
- PayPal Fees deducted - \$158.52

June 7, 2026

There were upwards of 12 or more vehicle break-ins throughout the neighborhood in the early morning hours of Sunday, June 7. Vehicles parked on Ashley Drive, Schuylkill Road, Macon Road, and Boilingbrook Parkway were broken into, mostly by smashing a window of the car. July 6, 2026

There have been a string of incidents with the same individual that resides [on] Ashley Drive. The police have been in the neighborhood 5+ times over the last 2 months because of the same kid who has been arrested for a number of issues. There have been posts in the Nextdoor app about him trespassing in yards and I personally found him incoherently drunk a few weeks ago at 5pm. I have a young child and this individual is becoming increasingly unpredictable and scary. They are renters in that house. Is there anything we can do

to contact the landlord and get them evicted from the property? Just last night he was arrested for armed robbery (you can see the arrest records on Montgomery county). Please advise on if there is anything we can do to get this person out of our neighborhood.

RCA Response: The RCA encourages all residents to report any illegal activity to the police. The more often the police hear about this person, the more patrolling of the street they'll do. Montgomery County provides public record of property owners, so you could try contacting the property owner about the police report: <https://apps.montgomerycountymd.gov/dhca-eproperty>

July 23, 2026

Hello, I work in the Randolph Hills Shopping Center and was wondering if you folks know why the County would put two Stop signs 25 feet apart? It makes no sense! That intersection has always been a Joke. This just makes it worse! Traffic is terrible now.

RCA Response: The RCA has reached out to MCDOT asking for some background on the decision to install the stop signs. We have not heard back.



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You Can Become a Foster to a Dog or Cat in Need by Ellen Bourbon

Are you considering adopting a dog or cat, but aren't sure you're ready to commit? Consider fostering instead! After my old husky mix, Rufus, died last year, I missed the companionship and the regular walks we used to take, but found I wasn't quite ready to adopt yet. At a Partnership for Animal Welfare (PAW) adoption show at PetSmart, one of the volunteers presented me with an opportunity: to foster one of their rescue dogs for a month.

Many pets find themselves in shelters through no fault of their own. Their owners may have lost their jobs, been forced to move to a new place that doesn't accept pets, been deployed overseas, or become ill and unable to care for their pets. Shelters can be very stressful places for animals, due to the noise and the unfamiliar surroundings. Foster homes give dogs and cats a safe, temporary place to decompress, feel safe, receive medical care, recover from spay/neuter surgery, remember what life in a loving home is like, and learn to trust again. If you foster through PAW, they pay all costs associated with fostering, including food and medical care. Fosters, whether short or long term, provide love, patience and care, and help the foster dog or cat's true personality shine, so PAW can make the best possible match with an adoptive family.

I wound up keeping my first foster for 7 weeks. We had

an application from a wonderful couple who fell in love with him, and he went to his forever home, where he's now receiving the love and attention he deserves. Over the past year, I've fostered five dogs all together, one of

which I adopted myself (often jokingly called a "foster fail"). Fosters also have first dibs on adopting their foster dog or cat. It's easy to become attached to a foster pet and can be hard to say goodbye when he or she gets adopted. It's a very rewarding experience, though, knowing that you've made a difference in the life of an animal, and brought joy to a person or a family that welcomes that animal into their home.

Josh Hart is a key member of the New York Knicks, the newly crowned National Basketball Association Champions. He's also a native of Randolph Hills!

Josh grew up in a house on Randolph Road. He attended Viers Mill Elementary School, was a Cub Scout in Pack 1081, and was a Boy Scout in Troop 1083. In those years, he could be seen in RCA-Land taking part in the many community service projects that the Scouts provide, such as annual food drives and stream cleans. He was one of the "elves" who handed out candy canes to the boys and girls who came out to see the fire truck that carried Santa Claus each year on his pre-Christmas visit to RCA-Land. He also pitched in and helped other Scouts complete Eagle Scout

service projects around the neighborhood—and since Troop 1083 produced many Eagles over the years, that amounted to a LOT of Eagle projects! Including, in 2013, Josh's own Eagle project.

Josh went on to play at Sidwell Friends High School in the District of Columbia. From there, he attended Villanova University, where he starred on the 2016 national collegiate championship team. He is one of the few basketball stars who have won both an NCAA and an NBA championship—and he is the first and only one, ever, who is also an Eagle Scout.

As far as I know, he's also the first one who hails from RCA-Land. Congratulations Josh!

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Dr. Norman Minner Rich

*Eagle Scout, Pioneer of Modern Military Vascular Surgery
and 60-Year Resident of Montgomery County*

Dr. Norman Rich died June 18, 2026 at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center in Bethesda. He was 92. Dr. Rich was a pioneering vascular trauma surgeon who spent nearly six decades transforming battlefield medicine and helped found the nation's only military medical school, the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS).

In May 2026, weeks before his death, Dr. Rich received the Outstanding Eagle Scout Award from the National Capital Area Council of Scouting America. He was nominated by his longtime friend, and fellow Montgomery County resident, retired Maryland State Senator S. Frank Shore, a strong supporter of the Boy Scouts, who cited Rich's lifetime of extraordinary public service as the reason he was deserving of this significant Eagle Scout recognition. Dr. Rich and Senator Shore cultivated a decades-long friendship rooted in their mutual dedication to public service and a passion for helping others.

And began to ask, "Can we decide to walk through this together as woman and man?"

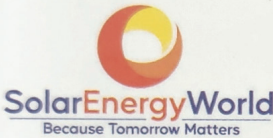
