President's Message

Where is RCA-land? Rockville? North Bethesda? You're not the only one confused! The telephone operator tells us we live in Kensington!

I object to the Community Phonebook describing zip code "20852" as "Pike." According to the United States Postal Service, the mailing address name of zip code area 20852 is "Rockville" or "North Bethesda," but never "Pike." In reality, very few 20852 addresses are physically located within the city limits of Rockville.

"The Pike" is the historical toll road that became Wisconsin Avenue/Rockville Pike/Frederick Road. The pike has a glorious history, both in Colonial and Civil War times. The nation-wide phrase "...goes/comes down the pike" began with our very own Rockville Pike. However, "The Pike" has always been used to describe the road itself, not a specific area. The pike could equally describe Bethesda, Rockville, points in-between, or points beyond.

The Community Phonebook lists Strathmore Hall under Bethesda, and that unquestionably is wrong. Strathmore Hall is actually located in North Bethesda. The "Schools" section lists Luxmanor Elementary and Tilden Middle schools as being in Rockville! Both these schools are physically located in North Bethesda. "Community Centers" lists the Montgomery Aquatic Center as being in Bethesda. The Aquatic Center is actually closer to the Rockville city limits than Strathmore or the two schools. The sign in front of the Aquatic Center proclaims its location as North Bethesda.

I wrote the DataNational company of Chantilly, VA that prints the Community PhoneBook, to tell them of their mistakes.

Minutes of the RCA General Meeting

December 6, 2001

President Kevin Kline opened the meeting by welcoming the Boy Scouts who were attending to earn Citizenship Merit Badges. The RCA assisted this Scouting effort by opening the meeting in a more formal manner, adhering to Roberts Rules of Order.

Approved by majority vote: the November Exec meeting minutes as published in the *Echo*, and the RCA/RCF operating budget. The budget was amended to defer spending \$650 on Welcome Wagon notebooks until next year, in order to balance projected income with expenses. Treasurer Richard Zierdt briefed us on the financial status, reporting that the RCA has combined assets of \$8,700.

Kevin and Richard then gave a briefing on area zoning, of all the commercial and road construction projects planned for the area. This included the news that the County agreed to our stipulation that the parking waiver for the new Loehmann's Plaza Chuck E. Cheese (in the former Rite-Aid) be limited to that restaurant only. If the Chuck E. Cheese closes, any replacement restaurant will have to re-apply for a zoning waiver.

Kevin quoted chapter and verse from the M-NCPPC Park Classification System, to demonstrate that Randolph Hills Local Park falls under the classification of "Smaller types of parks that are primarily used by local residents and nearby areas..." The point being that even the County's own literature states that it is our park, to be used primarily by RCA'ers. Park representatives are always surprised when we point this out to them.

Approved by majority vote: to opposed state bill MC 207-02 that would increase School Board salaries from \$12,000 to \$18,500 (with the Board President earning \$4,000 above that). Board members would also be eligible for health benefits. The RCA opposes this salary increase because it comes at the same time the School system is facing budget cutbacks, and just proposed eliminating 168 employees, and increasing class size. Overall, the school system budget will decrease 5 percent, when last year it went up 10 percent, and 9 percent the year before that.

Later, RCA School Committee member George Gadbois reported that the Downcounty Consortium appears dead in the water due to lack of funds. The County was relying on Federal funding, and when that failed together with a director change, the initiative slowed down. The time line has moved back one year and the Wheaton signatures are undergoing some regrouping.

Approved by unanimous vote: for the RCA to send a letter voicing our concerns about the poor quality of Wheaton HS, and urge the School Board to

change the school boundaries so our kids can attend another high school. We will also recommend that Rocking Horse Elementary be reopened. The RCA Treasurer recently had an opportunity to meet with our School Board Representative Pat O'Neill and discuss our concerns.

Approved by unanimous vote: that the RCA write a letter to the County supporting the idea that citizens and civic groups be allowed to donate money for their local schools.

Approved by unanimous vote: that the RCA write a letter to the Federal Highway Administration that an exemption to "independent utility" be granted, or else that the MD 355 Montrose/Randolph intersection project be delayed until the County Council fully funds the Montrose Parkway.

The RCA Execs explained "independent utility" means that road projects funded by the federal government must "stand alone" on its own merits, rather than be part of a larger transportation project – like the Montrose Parkway.

The Execs discussed local traffic problems by displaying and explaining a large blueprint of proposed changes to Randolph Road. The Execs object to the County's plan of closing the existing Randolph Road,

and merely replacing it with the Montrose Parkway. (However, the RCA is in favor of the Montrose Parkway). This plan doesn't add additional road capacity. The County's idea is that easing the traffic flow through the intersections (at Montrose & Rockville Pike, and over the railroad tracks) will allow for more traffic. The Execs want to keep Randolph Road as it is, and add a new Montrose Parkway.

Traffic build-up on Rocking Horse was also discussed, including the RCA's previous idea of installing a traffic light at Boiling Brook/Rocking Horse. The County has been unresponsive.

Approved by unanimous vote: to donate \$200 to the new Girl Scout Troop. The membership welcomed the new troop to RCA-land!

The president ended the meeting at 10pm sharp!



As you may know, the old system of saving Giant and Safeway receipts and giving them to schools to obtain educational equipment has been replaced with an electronic system. The new system uses your Giant Bonus Card or Safeway Club Card to automatically credit the school(s) you designate at the time of your purchases. These programs run from the end of September through the end of March 2002, so it's not too late to sign up! If you sign up before the end of a month, Giant and Safeway will credit your purchases for that entire month. For instance, if you sign up by the end of February, the stores will credit your purchases from the entire month of February.

For those of you who haven't already done so, I would like to encourage you to designate our RCA public schools to receive credit for your purchases. Our schools will use the credit they receive to purchase much-needed educational equipment and supplies. There are two ways you can designate the school(s) of your choice: 1) you can sign up at the Customer Service counters at Safeway and Giant; or 2) you can sign up online at http://www.giantfood.com/bonuscard_aplus.htm and http://proghqtrs.com/safeway. The public schools our children from the RCA area attend include Veirs Mill Elementary School, Garrett Park Elementary School, Parkland Middle School, Tilden Middle School, Wheaton High School, and Walter Johnson High School. Thank you for helping our local public schools with every trip you make to the grocery store!

Campbell's Labels and General Mills Box Tops for **Education Programs**

Our local schools also are collecting Campbell's product labels and General Mills box tops to help earn educational equipment and supplies for the schools. These programs run year-round.

The History of RCA-land

RCA-land is Veirs Mill!

Last month we explained that in 1860 your neighborhood was Montrose! Montrose was a small community (including a US Post Office) just west of where the railroad tracks cross Randolph Road, where the old Montrose Schoolhouse was built in the 1930's. It never existed where present-day Montrose Road is today.

But before 1860, your neighborhood was also know as Veirs Mill! Mills used water power to grind corn and other grains, and were very important centers before the advent of steam power. Veirs Mill was one of 14 that operated on the stream known as Rock Creek in the 1700s and 1800s, according to county historical documents. It was built in 1838, just south of Rockville, where Veirs Mill Rd crosses Rock Creek.

The mill went into operation soon after Samuel C. Veirs bought 400 acres of farmland and forest from the original land-grant owners [that's RCA-land!]. Veirs, whose family came to Maryland before 1700, was "an important figure in the county," wrote historian Roger Brooke Farquhar in 1952. "For years he was judge of the Orphans Court, serving almost continually from 1864 to 1880."

Veirs was also among several Montgomery County residents sent to Baltimore in 1861 to debate whether the state should secede in the Civil War, Farquhar wrote.

Veirs Mill (as in the actual grist mill) "operated successfully for seventy-five or eighty years and provided a great market for farmers in the surrounding area," according to Farquhar. It not only ground grain from the Veirs family farm but did the same for other farmers, making money off the grinding fees and selling flour.

County Historical Society Librarian Pat Andersen believes the mill might have been a much bigger success than Farquhar's modest assessment indicates. She notes that another historian found that the "Veirs and Bro. Mill was worth \$230,000 in the 1880 US Census, had 14 employees and a 100bushel per day capacity."

"That would have been a really big business in those days" Andersen said. "Imagine what \$230,000 would be 120 years later."

Historian Rob Braunberg also found other details. For instance, the mill sold flour as the Rockville Flour Milling Co. The brand names were Veirs Mill and Bouquet.

Local mills, such as the Veirs Mill operation, went out of fashion in the early 1900s, when regional milling centers on major rail lines proved more economical. According to the county, the land where the Veirs Mill facility sat is now parkland!

Zoning News

The drive-through Wendy's restaurant is being built at 5001 Nicholson Lane. It's on Nicholson, just past the bridge over the railroad tracks, on the north side of the street. This tiny treed area is so small, only a drive-through can fit! The RCA complained that the County made that decision without consulting RCA-land, the nearest neighborhood.

Montrose Office Center II

Construction began on a new office building on Rockville Pike, between the Forum Condo building and the existing Montrose Office Center I. The new Montrose Office Center II will have underground parking for 194 spaces. Landscaping enhancements include trees and shrubs along the Pike, a bike trail, and fencing.

Did You Know... 100 years ago: in 1901

- The tallest structure in the world was the Eiffel Tower.
- The American flag had 45 stars. Arizona, Oklahoma, New Mexico, Hawaii and Alaska hadn't been admitted to the Union yet.
- Alabama, Mississippi, Iowa, and Tennessee were each more heavily populated than California. With a mere 1.4 million residents, California was only the 21st most populous state in the Union.
- The population of Las Vegas, Nevada was 30.
- The average U.S. life expectancy was forty-seven.
- Only 14 Percent of U.S. homes had a bathtub.
- Most US women washed their hair once a month, and used borax or egg yolks for shampoo.
- Only 8 percent of US homes had a telephone. A threeminute call from Denver to New York City cost eleven dollars.
- There were 8,000 cars in the US, and 144 miles of paved roads. The speed limit in most cities was 10 mph.
- Ninety percent of all U.S. physicians had no college education. Instead, they attended medical schools, many of which were condemned in the press and by the government as "substandard."
- More than 95% of all births in the US took place at home.
- Canada passed a law prohibiting poor people from entering the country.
- The average US wage was 22 cents an hour. The average US salary was \$200-\$400 per year. A competent accountant could expect to earn \$2000 per year, a dentist \$2,500 per year, a veterinarian between \$1,500 and \$4,000 per year, and a mechanical engineer about \$5,000 per year.
- Sugar cost four cents a pound. Eggs were fourteen cents a dozen. Coffee cost fifteen cents a pound.

 - 4. Heart disease;
 - 5. Stroke.
- Crossword puzzles, canned beer, and iced tea hadn't been invented.
- There were no Mother's Day or Father's Day.
- One in ten US adults were literate. Only 6 percent of all Americans had graduated from high school.

- Marijuana, heroin, and morphine were all available over the counter at corner drugstores. According to one pharmacist, "Heroin clears the complexion, gives buoyancy to the mind, regulates the stomach and the bowels, and is, in fact, a perfect guardian of health."
- Eighteen percent of households in the US had at least one full-time servant or domestic.
- There were about 230 reported murders in the US.

Late-breaking News: Animals Poisoned in RCA-Land

Several residents have reported animals being poisoned in our neighborhood. So far 17 squirrels, 2 crows, and 2 pet dogs have been poisoned. The dogs were both poisoned on Christmas day, and rushed to the animal emergency room on Nebel Street. The vet said it was a "harsh toxin," not anti-freeze, and not rat poison.

One resident witnessed two squirrels dying on his property. The State of Maryland came out, and said to wrap any new dead in plastic (wear disposable gloves!), freeze it (ugh!) and call them.


